

## **Bullet Pointed Summary of Curriculum Policy**

Giant Steps Tasmania uses the core knowledge, understanding, skills and capabilities outlined by ACARA as the basis for the unique Concept-based programs it offers students from Prep to Year 12.

The School delivers the Australian Curriculum for students in Prep to Year 10 as follows:

- The Arts
- English
- Health and Physical Education
- Humanities and Social Sciences
- Languages (Giant Steps Tasmania focuses on equipping all students with a means of communication, so teaches the use of AACs, such as ProLoQuo and LAMP and also AUSLAN)
- Mathematics
- Science
- Technologies

The School delivers the TASC Curriculum in Years 11 and 12.

The School utilises the General Capabilities of the Australian Curriculum:

- Literacy
- Numeracy
- Information and communication technology capability
- Critical and creative thinking
- Personal and social capability
- Ethical understanding
- Intercultural understanding

The school addresses the Cross-Curriculum Priorities:

- Asia and Australia's engagement with Asia
- Sustainability
